4 April 2021

First Reading Acts 10:34. 37-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

The passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

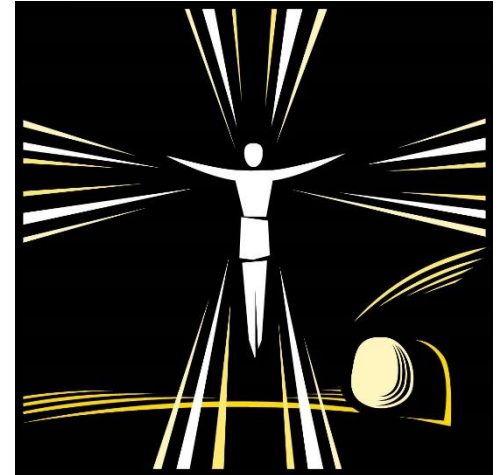
When the sabbath was over, Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices with which to go and anoint him. And very early in the morning on the first day of the week they went to the tomb, just as the sun was rising.

They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' But when they looked they could see that the stone – which was very big – had already been rolled back. On entering the tomb they saw a young man in a white robe seated on the right hand side, and they were struck with amazement. But he said to them, 'There is no need for alarm. You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified: he has risen, he is not here. See, here is the place where they laid him. But you must go and tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going before you to Galilee; it is there you will see him, just as he told you."'

REFLECTION

Dawn has Broken – The Son is Risen

Women go to the tomb as dawn is breaking. The Power of Darkness which had Jesus unjustly sentenced, cruelly tortured and buried in the pitch blackness of the tomb, is conquered by the Son-Rise of all sun rises flooding our world and the whole of human history with Divine Light and Energy.

This is the heart of our faith as Catholic Christians, which we celebrate with bon-fire (good fire) in darkness at the Easter Vigil. From that earthly element we light the Easter candle and the Exsultet is sung: 'Be glad, let earth be glad as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King.'

The resurrection itself is nowhere described in the gospels, but we do have appearances of the Risen Lord Jesus. The first appearance was to a woman, Mary of Magdala. A title given to her by the early church was 'Apostle to the Apostles' because she was the bearer of the message which the male disciples initially did not believe. But eventually they too believed that Death had been done to death because the Son had risen.

Christ's body was transfigured by the energy of Divine Love and we can, by grace, participate in that resurrection life of Our Lord. A glorious destiny awaits us, as indeed it awaits the whole cosmos as it is to be transformed by that resurrection life recreating the whole of creation.

We could take a moment to pray that we, along with all that matters, are graced with the life-giving energy of the Risen Son and that we may join Mary of Magdala in spreading the Good News of Christ's victory over death. Alleluia!

St Patrick's Cemetery Queen Street – Plot for Sale

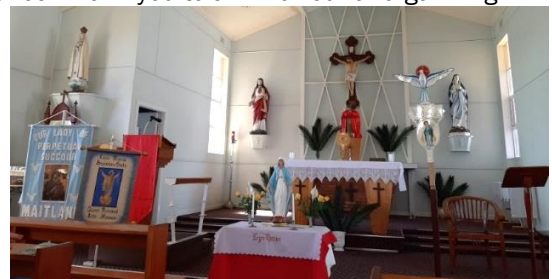

and it almost feels like a normal celebration for us for we can already belt out our Easter hallelujahs inside our Churches. Yet, we remain anxious and worried for the challenges that our current circumstances throw at us – the end of the JobKeeper, the pressing unemployment fears, the recent floodings, among others. For us who are foreigners in this land, our hearts palpitate for our loved ones in our homelands who remain vulnerable to the corona virus accentuated by our government's incompetence to help their people and to address the pandemic.

Although, it is Easter, it really feels like we are the women who bought spices to anoint the remains of Jesus' body (see Mk 16:1-8). They feel beaten for they have witnessed their Lord crucified and die on the cross. They witnessed him being laid in the tomb. And, when the sabbath was over, they came to search for the dead while worried on who could roll the stone for them. It is Easter yet we remain worried and anxious for all the disheartening sensations life throws at us.

But Easter reminds us not to worry when we face the daily dramas of our lives. This season reminds us not to look for the dead and be disheartened by the stones that we cannot move in life. The Lord is risen, and he has overcome death. Easter encourages us to face the empty tombs of our lives, our empty pockets, and our bleeding hearts with deep and great joy for the Lord is truly risen. Yes, it is Easter. And we are the children of the Easter morning. May our lives witness a life marked by courage and great joy.

Further, this year has been marked by Pope Francis as Amoris Laetitia Family. Francis is inviting us to celebrate the beauty and joy of love in the family. I am inviting everyone to discern with our community on how we can promote and walk with families following the Amoris Laetitia. Let us, as a community, look for ways on how we can build a community that celebrates beauty and the joy of love. I would deeply appreciate to hear your suggestions and to learn from you.

For the Catholic Communities of Broke, Glendonbrook, Singleton, Branxton and Greta, Fr Anthony, Brother Solomon and I would continue to pray for everyone's safety and well-being. A blessed Easter to all of you!
