First ReadingIs 35:1-6, 10A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy.

The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God.

Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid.

'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.'

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy, for those the Lord has ransomed shall return.

They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.

Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming. Think of a farmer: how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn rains and the spring rains! You too have to be patient; do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.'

As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'

The Right Question

John was languishing in prison, held captive by the local agent of the Roman Empire. Perhaps he was looking for evidence that Jesus was the One who would throw off Roman despotism. In answer to his questing, Jesus replied that John should rather look at what was happening on the ground in His healing ministry and orientation to the poor. **Those** are the signs that the reign of God has begun.

I admire John the Baptist because he was prepared to seek and accept the answer to the question which was crucial to him, even though the answer might upset his preconceptions. He was a true seeker after Truth.

All our activities as a parish in building community, forming faith, serving the poor, participating in the liturgy, should be undertaken so that a seeker after Truth might see and hear the evidence of the presence and mission of the risen Lord Jesus Christ amongst us.

We could pause for a moment to simply pray in the spirit of Advent: 'Come, Lord Jesus' to satisfy the restlessness of the questing heart.

The Lighting of the Advent Candles

Third Sunday of Advent: The Shepherd's Candle

Celebrant: On the First Sunday of Advent we lit the prophets' candle - the candle of hope. Filled with the hope that Christ will come again to fulfill all of God's promises, we light that candle of hope again.

(The Prophet's candle is lit as the following is said)

Celebrant: Jesus, Word of God. Light of the world, born of Mary, give us your hope this day.

- All: Come, Lord Jesus. Come, Lord Jesus. Come, Lord Jesus. Come, and be born in our hearts.
- Celebrant: Last week we lit the Bethlehem Candle the Candle of Peace and so today we light it again and remind ourselves that the one who was born at Bethlehem is the one who brings us peace.

(The Bethlehem candle is lit as the following is said)

- Celebrant: Jesus, Prince of Peace, Light in darkness, born of Mary, give us your peace this night. All: Come, O Prince of Peace. Come, O Prince of Peace. Come, O Prince of Peace. Come, and be born in our hearts.
- Celebrant: Love never ends. So today we light the Shepherds' candle. On that holy night, love shone like a light shining in a dark place. The shepherd's saw it and responded. May the light shine for us and may we respond to Jesus God's love to us and the one who shows us how to love each other.

(The Shepherd's candle is lit as the following is said)

Celebrant: Rejoice my spirit, in God my Saviour, Christ comes with healing offering us his joy. All: Our hearts are open, Our hearts are open. Our hearts are open. Come, and be born in our hearts.
