#### First Reading

Is 7:10-14

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The Lord spoke to Ahaz and said, 'Ask the Lord your God for a sign for yourself coming either from the depths of Sheol or from the heights above.' 'No', Ahaz answered 'I will not put the Lord to the test.'

Then Isaiah said:

'Listen now, House of David: are you not satisfied with trying the patience of men

without trying the patience of my God, too?

The Lord himself, therefore, will give you a sign. It is this: the maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son whom she will call Immanuel, a name which means "God-is-with-us".'

## Second Reading Rom 1:1-7 A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus who has been called to be an apostle, and specially chosen to preach the Good News that God promised long ago through his prophets in the scriptures.

This news is about the Son of God, who, according to the human nature he took, was a descendant of David: it is about Jesus Christ our Lord who, in the order of the spirit, the spirit of holiness that was in him, was proclaimed Son of God in all his power through his resurrection from the

dead. Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

#### Gospel

Mt 1:18-24

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity. decided to divorce informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel,

a name which means 'God-is-with-us'. When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.

The Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.



#### Just Man Dreaming

Joseph could not ignore Mary's pregnancy, but he had an exceptional large-heartedness, so that he preserved a future for Mary even though she had apparently wronged him.

If he had gone to sleep in a frame of mind to avenge his honour, he would not have been ready to have the deepest levels of his consciousness stirred in the way God wanted. In the deep sleep of a just and good man, Joseph was enlightened as to dimension the divine of pregnancy. The old cycle of human history, literally generation after generation, was being broken. Something utterly new had happened.

You and I are just as likely to receive an intuition as to God's plan for us in the depths of sleep: who we really are, who we are destined to be, where we fit in to God's plan for transforming the whole of creation. When we get these instructive moments in our sleep, what can we do when we wake up? We can do what Joseph did: get up and do what is needed to fulfil the message.

We could pause for a moment to thank Joseph for showing what dreams can be made of. Tonight might be the night!

# The Lighting of the Advent Candles Fourth Sunday of Advent: The Angel's Candle

Celebrant: On the First Sunday of Advent, we lit the prophets' candle - the candle of hope. Filled with the hope that Christ will come again to fulfill all of God's promises to us we light that candle of hope again.

(The Prophet's candle is lit as the following is said)

Celebrant: Jesus, Word of God. Light of the world, born of Mary, give us your hope this day.

All: Come. Lord Jesus. Come. Lord Jesus. Come. Lord Jesus.

Come, and be born in our hearts.

Celebrant: We lit the Bethlehem Candle, on the Second Sunday of Advent. It is the Candle of Peace and so today we light it again and remind ourselves that the one who was born at Bethlehem is the one who brings us peace.

(The Bethlehem candle is lit as the following is said)

Celebrant: Jesus, Prince of Peace, Light in darkness, born of Mary, give us your peace this night.

All: Come, O Prince of Peace. Come, O Prince of Peace. Come, O Prince of Peace. Come, and be born in our hearts.

Celebrant: Last week we lit the Shepherds' candle - the candle of joy. For on that holy night, love shone like a light shining in a dark place. The shepherds' saw it and responded with joy. As the light the candle today may the light shine for us and may we respond with joy to Jesus who brings God's love to us.

(The Shepherd's candle is lit as the following is said)

Celebrant: Rejoice my spirit, in God my Saviour, Christ comes with healing offering us his joy.

All: Our hearts are open, Our hearts are open. Our hearts are open.

Come, and be born in our hearts.

Celebrant: On this the Fourth Sunday - the Angels' Sunday - we light the candle of love. For the angels announced the coming of the one who is love incarnate. May we share in the love of Jesus who is Emmanuel.

(The Angel's candle is lit as the following is said)

Celebrant: Light has come to us, light in our darkness, Jesus Emmanuel, bearer of God's love for us.

All: Come, Emmanuel. Come, Emmanuel. Come, Emmanuel.

Come, and be born in our hearts.
