Make no mistake about it: if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: The Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he

knows how useless they are, or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all your servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

Gospel Mt 5:38-48 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'

Warfare and the Church

'Be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect.' Is Jesus advocating rather fault-less-ness? static Not verv appealing! No, the Greek word is closer to the idea of a perfect wine - one that has matured and has reached its full potential. So, Our Lord is saying, 'Be a person who is everything you are capable of being.'

Our Lord gives a striking example of the challenge. God does not withhold life-giving sun and rain from people because they are bad or dishonest, nor extinguish the life of human beings because they are evil, because they are enemies.

What are the implications for Church teaching on capital punishment or warfare? Note that Jesus' command: 'You must be ... ' is directed to You in the plural. It is communal, social. The Church community must listen. Is the Holy Spirit moving us in a direction not experienced since its first three centuries?

We could pause for a moment to pray on behalf of those who want to do us harm, the better to hear: 'Blessed are the peacemakers.'

Branxton Parish Finance Update

St Brigid's Church in Branxton will receive a fresh coat of paint internally next month thanks to a generous bequest left to the parish. The contract for work was awarded to Topaz Dynamics Pty Ltd who will also strip back the floor in the sacristy and install a handrail up to the altar.

A second rental property has been purchased by the Branxton Parish in a strata complex at 5 Maitland St, East Branxton. One unit has a new tenant, and the other is being advertised for rent. The sale of the land in Station Street between the old convent and the old presbytery is in the process of being finalized with conditions needing to be met for the subdivision before it can be completed. The sale of this land will assist with the repayment of the loan for the rental unit.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2023 PREPARED BY WOMEN OF TAIWAN

You are invited to join in fellowship with our local churches for this year's World Day of Prayer which will be held on <u>Friday 3 March 2023</u> at the following locations:

- St John's Anglican Church, Cessnock Road, Branxton at 10am (Please bring a plate to share for morning tea)
- Seventh Day Adventist Church, Doyle Street, Singleton at 7pm



The theme of the worship service "*I Have Heard About Your Faith*," based on the letter to the Ephesians, is an invitation to active listening, which is the ground of our prayers. Following the example of the letter (1:15-19), where the author praises the church for their faith in Jesus and love toward all the saints, the worship service contextualizes the witness of the saints with the stories from Taiwan.

The worship service shares the letters of encouragement sent to women who faced suffering and injustice. Their stories of faith contemplate issues that are shared by women and girls around the world and that continue to challenge us to prayerful action.

They remind us of the urgency to protect the environment and have a nuclearfree homeland; to be aware of the gender stereotypes women face when defying the traditional role in the workplace or in the family, and to care for the healing of the victims of verbal and sexual abuses. It also brings to light the hidden struggle of the essential workers during the pandemic who had to balance between work and family in a vulnerable economic situation. The sisters thank God for the natural resources of the island and pray for wisdom in face of the political isolation of Taiwan in the international community. They ask for our prayers.
