


## Hope Tree Project 14 - Martha's Piggery

# Home Care for the Disabled

Sr Dhanya is working as a teacher in a special school for the mentally challenged in Madhya Pradesh, central India.

She visits villages and helps disabled children and their families. She gives ADL (Activities of Daily Living) skills to children and trains parents to provide these to their children. She gives physiotherapy to children and trains the parents to give it too. She helps them to obtain disability government certificates and other documents which will entitle them to get a pension of \$20 per month and other travel concessions. The government does not provide any other assistance to the disabled, so she provides help as needed. She assists with clothes, food, wheelchairs, and crutches and other needs.

Part of the collections from our Christmas Masses will be donated to Sr Dhanya's work.
