LEO'S LENS REFLECTION BY NICK BRODIE

Speaking to representatives of other Churches and Christian communities, Pope Leo XIV strongly expressed his interest in unity. He wants to prioritise 'seeking the re-establishment of full and visible communion among all those who profess the same faith in God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.'

Unity, Leo pointed out, is 'a constant concern of mine'. All Christians, he added, have a duty to pray and work toward it.

Reflecting on this mystery, Leo pointed out 'that synodality and ecumenism are closely linked.' Like Pope Francis before him, Leo encourages all members of the Church to journey together as a listening people.

Desiring 'to continue Pope Francis' commitment to promoting the synodal nature of the Catholic Church and developing new and concrete forms for an ever stronger synodality in ecumenical relations', Leo therefore encourages us all to do our part. We might start by becoming truly open to embracing those who might seem different. A truly Catholic Church, after all, is a unity of diversity.

Leo's example reminds all of us that we are called to be a community that can reach out to others. Our oneness in Christ means we must reach out with Christ to the many.

Evangelise: Evangelising young people and empowering them to share their faith with others.


Listen: Listening to young people and providing them with the opportunity to share and discuss the unique


challenges they face in today's world.
