Hope Tree Project 29: Help Build a Home for Bharath Kumar

Our current Hope Tree Group project is to support **Mr. Singarapu Bharath Kumar**, aged 26, of Chinthakani Parish, Khammam Diocese, Telangana, India.

Five years ago, on his way home from work, a serious accident left Bharath completely bedridden. He has undergone more than 20 major surgeries.

He was the sole earner for his family. After the accident, his wife left him. Now, his elderly parents and grandmother struggle daily, labouring in the fields, often forced to beg for money to cover Bharath's medicines and basic needs, while his father stays home to provide full-time care. They currently live in a temporary shed.

Construction had begun on a small, dignified house for them, using funds the local Sisters had been able to raise and a government grant, but the funds have now been exhausted.

URGENT NEED: ₹100,000 Rupees (or \$1800 AUD) is urgently needed to complete the brickwork. Finishing this stage is vital so they can then secure further government grants for the roofing. **\$1500 has been donated so far!**

Please help restore dignity and faith for Bharath and his devoted family by providing safe shelter for them.
