**LEO'S LENS**

**REFLECTION BY NICK BRODIE**

While the familiar often feels comfortable, the Gospel reminds us to seek always to be ready for the Christ who approaches us from unexpected directions. This, Pope Leo explains, is why the Church's rediscovery of the synodal pathway is so important.

As the Pope says, the Church has reached a moment in its history when 'it is necessary to engage in a genuine synodal exercise, that is, to walk together in order to question ourselves, to begin some experimentation and to initiate a serene and frank discernment.'

This is a critical moment for us. The Pope wants us to realise that, if embraced willingly, 'these experiences can help us to discern the future.' The smallest of conversations can lead to great things.

The Pope offers the example of people struggling to find sufficient and dignified work. He urges us 'to be a Church close to the world of work, compassionate and embodied, so that the proclamation of the Gospel may become a concrete presence of consolation and hope.' In this light the Pope wants us to consider how we might adopt 'the style of proximity, listening to the struggles and hardships of the people.'

We should always remember that John urged his followers to look at 'the Chosen One of God' when he saw Jesus approaching.

## **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY**

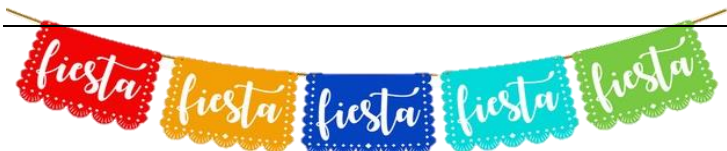

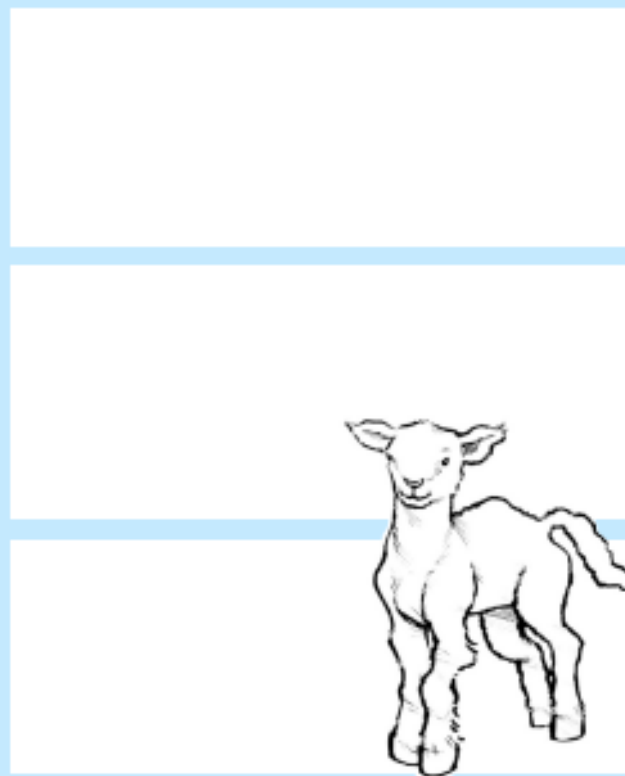
# Here is the Lamb of God
